



10 DAY OF FREE SERVICE TO FILL OUT CITIZENSHIP APPLICATIONS

Fort Worth, TX (January 2017). - In anticipation of a new Federal Administration, Proyecto Inmigrante ICS, Inc. will be offering free services to complete the citizen application (N-400).

This 10-day event will be held at Proyecto Inmigrante's offices located in Fort Worth and Irving, from Tuesday, January 10 through Saturday, January 21, 2017.

According to the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS), in the first 3/4 of the 2016 fiscal year, more than 740,000 lawful permanent residents in the country became citizens of the United States, but an estimated 8.8 million lawful permanent residents are eligible to naturalize, and approximately 250,000 of them live in North Texas.

"The objective of this initiative is to help the Lawful Permanent Residents (LPR's) of the State to obtain their citizenship and promote family reunification," said Douglas Interiano, CEO and founder of Proyecto Inmigrante.

- **Any lawful permanent resident interested in taking advantage of this opportunity must meet the following requirements:**
- **No criminal record**
- **Be 18 years of age or older**
- **Have been a lawful permanent resident for at least 5 years or 3 years if you are married to a U.S. citizen.**
- **Have not lived outside the United States for more than 6 months.**
- **Have good moral character**
- **Speak, read, and write basic English**
- **Knowledge of U.S. government and history**

Proyecto Inmigrante ICS, Inc offices are open Tuesday through Saturday from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. Qualifying individuals who are interested in completing the citizenship application (N-400) for free must make an appointment by calling 888-793 -2182 ext. 201

Note: It is recommended that the individuals who qualify bring a copy and original documents of the Permanent Resident Card, Driver's License, and Social Security (both sides). Along with these documents it is critical to bring with you dates, places of work, and travel dates outside the U.S. for the past 5 years. Qualifying Legal Permanent Residents are required to cover the filing fee requested by USCIS to process the application (N-400).
