The U.S. Supreme Court heard the voice of millions of immigrants

They will make a decision on the DAPA and Extended DACA executive orders.

Fort Worth, TX. - The United States Supreme Court, agreed to hear the appeal submitted in November 2015 by the Justice Department, to review the DAPA and Extended DACA programs.

"The decision of the Supreme Court revitalizes the immigrant community's confidence in the judiciary system," said Douglas Interiano, executive director of Proyecto Inmigrante ICS, Inc.

He added, "Although this is only a first step in the appeal process before the highest Court in the country, the decision gives a sense of peace and hope to the millions of undocumented immigrants who could benefit from the executive actions, particularly with the recent raids by the Immigration and Customs Enforcement agency (ICE)."

DAPA and Extended DACA programs have been suspended since February 2015. The Federal Judge for the District Court in Brownsville, Andrew Hanen, ordered to suspend the application of the immigration programs in response to a lawsuit filed by 26 states. The ruling was upheld by the 5th Circuit Court of Appeals in New Orleans.

The U.S. Supreme Court may be issuing a ruling by June of this year.
